Observe them and then go home, change and try to go out and dress as person and convince others he is that – dress like character 4) Motivation – goal that the character – why do they do what they do? 5) Emotional Memory – most important to go with writing – didn't want actors creating façade, but feel the emotion – put mindset of character – genuinely experience it – keep journal – ie varying degrees of anger – calm anger to explosive anger and everything in between ie: Calm Anger – think about time when so angry, you were calm – how did that feel and how did that look? What was going through your mind. You can pepper these details in your writing. Scent and touch are underused when it comes to characters – touching something – feels different to everybody – small reason why feel the bumps – tiny detail about why you feel bumps on a table Emotional Memory – take your own emotional memory and put that in to story – what you've experienced and if have personal experience, can put those in – but if not direct experience, put in something that is similar – find something akin Mining Yourself to find different emotions that you've experienced.
