Grant Applications

Tip: give yourself lots of time—start a couple of months in advance.

Tip: jury is different every time

Tip: creative and compelling; concise and clear; quality of ideas, not volume of words

Tip: Draft in Word, then copy into their online boxes. Proofread!

Calgary Arts Development (CADA): Individual Artist Program

- May 25
- All Artists (not just writers)
- \$5000 or \$10,000
- Invest in you as an artist, not in a project
 - Creation of Work
 - Professional Development
 - Risk Taking

Alberta Foundation for the Arts (AFA): Individual Artist Grant

- Sept. 1 or Feb 1
- Literary Arts
- Up to \$15,000
- For:
 - Art production
 - Marketing
 - o Research
 - Professional Development
 - o Travel

Canada Council (CCA): Explore and Create: develop skills and enrich knowledge

- No deadline but applications are reviewed on the 12th of September & 6th of April
- Literary Arts
- Up to \$25,000
- For:
 - o Professional development
 - o Research and creation: create new works
 - o Concept to realization: finish stuff and present it

Other

• Access Copyright; Older Writer Grant, etc.

In general, all grants consist of:

- 1. Eligibility / Portal Access
 - a. Are you a professional artist (proof required)
 - i. Recognized by peers
 - ii. Professional publication
 - iii. Letter of reference
 - b. Do you have outstanding final reports?
 - c. Allow minimum 2 weeks for portal access

- 2. Form: contact info, etc
- 3. Applicant agreement
- 4. Project description: this is the hardest part: where you have to build your case
 - a. Objectives
 - b. Planned Activities/rationale/sequence/timeline
 - c. Expected Results/benefits
- 5. Budget
 - a. Eligible expenses (eg: subsistence)
 - b. Ineligible expenses (eg: capital expenses)
 - c. Your contribution/other support
- 6. Supplementary Materials
 - a. Resume
 - b. Writing sample: Doesn't have to be a single story—variety can be good
 - c. Official invitations, itineraries, confirmations/acceptance into a course
 - d. Marketing plan (if that is what you are applying for)
 - e. Additional support materials: Letters of reference, reviews, etc.

Get Help

- Writing tips
- GATE User guide
- Budget examples
- Call their office with questions
- Pre-submission assessment: (2+ months)

Assessment:

- Juries of peers don't necessarily know your genre so be explicit (consider your audience)
- Criteria:
 - o Impact of the project on the artist
 - o Artistic merit
 - o Budget is reasonable for the project
 - o Ability of the applicant to carry out the project
 - Achievements to date
 - Personal objectives
- Results are final—you can't get individual feedback on why you didn't get it
- Will hear back in 5 months (AFA)
- Might get "Highly Recommended" status which might/might not result in funding

Requirements once you have received a grant

- Spend the money on the project, in the given time frame or request change
- Do the project even if you only get partial funding
- Final report
 - Your project (eg: copy of your novel)
 - o Financial accounting
 - o Certificate of completed course of study, etc
 - Written final report
- Acknowledgement
