8:00 PM	Skills Session Turbo-Charging Your Word-Count Rachel Aaron - How to Write 10K Words a Day Engineer - analyzed and created solutions Spent a few minutes sketching out a scene. If she spent more time, she is writing the scene It spun story in her head. She knows what is going on, so boom, she goes from 2000 words to 10,000 words. If do nothing else, this will increase your output. She made spreadsheets to find more efficiencies - writes everything she can about her word count. Started noticing patterns. Noticed when she got work done. She noticed that she got better words when away from home, etc. Also need enthusiasm - scenes she really liked to write Need all three: Knowledge - what she will write Timing - when she will do it for best word count Enthusiasm - does she want to write it? With all three, get up to 10K words per day and she finished her project with weeks to spare. Gave her time that she did not expect. Since 2011, Rachel Aaron has written 16 books. Do not have to write 10K words per day to be successful Use spreadsheet to gain an idea of metrics - when	Renee Bennett
