Novel	Short Story			
Genre defines expectations (pacing, in media res, open/closed ending, agency, etc)				
Reader must care about the protag (sympathetic or at least understandable)				
Protag, driven by want/need; attitudes & beliefs about theme illustrated scenically				
Start as close to the end as possible (what is "as possible"?)				
Minimal backstory (protag's ghost vs shameful backstory secrets motivates his actions)				
Sensory writing; show vs tell				
Dialogue				
Succinct (what is "succinct"?)				
Mood, Voice, Emotion				
Ending answers the story question (story question more clearly stated)				
One protag, unless you are advanced	One protag			
Many antags	One antag (except insofar as everyone is antag)			
Can have multiple POVs; One POV per scene	One POV (usually)			
Many settings	Limited settings			
Can take place over days, years (millennia)	Usually one time period			
Central theme, but can be multi-themed	Central theme (SF holds a mirror up to society)			
Hook can be bridging tension	Hook is immediate			
Multiple conflicts, subplots	Focus on one conflict; no subplots			
Structure can include more obstacles/twists	Structure more direct (see below)
